On or after 08/04/2023 the City of Muncie will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of funds for the FY2023 Community Development Block Grant Program (authorized by Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended), and FY 2023 HOME Investment Partnership Program (authorized by the National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, as amended), to undertake the following projects:

Tier 1 Broad Review, projects will be located Citywide.

Tier 2 review will be site-specific for the following projects:

Homeowner Rehabilitation (CDBG)

Housing rehabilitation services for LMI homeowners including roof replacement, HVAC repair/replacement and other repairs 24 CFR 58.35(a)(3)(i)

Infrastructure (CDBG) \$1,000

Milling and paving, sidewalk construction/ replacement, accessibility and other infrastructure improvements 24 CFR 58.35(a)(1)

Clearance (CDBG) \$252,300

Demolition of dilapidated structures, asbestos inspection and abatement, dumpsters and related services 24 CFR 58.35(a)(4)(i)

Recovery Housing Acquisition (CDBG) \$250,000 Acquisition cost and design services for a recovery home.

Southern Terrace--50 three-bedroom single family and duplex units, 25 at one location, 25 on scattered sites.

- Historic Preservation, National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, particularly sections 106 and 110; 36 CFR Part 800.
- Noise Abatement and Control, Noise Control Act of 1972, as amended by the Quiet Communities Act of 1978; 24 CFR Part 51 Subpart B (when creating new housing units).
- Wetlands Protection, Executive Order 11990, particularly sections 2 and 5.
- Environmental Justice, Executive Order 12898

Mitigation Measures/Conditions/Permits (if any): Project sites will be rejected if they do not conform to any of the laws and regulations covered by the Tier 2 review.

The activity/activities proposed are categorically excluded under HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58 from National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements per 24 CFR 58.35. An Environmental Review Record (ERR) that documents the environmental determinations for these projects is on file at:

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Muncie certifies to HUD that Dan Ridenour, Certifying Officer, in his capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Muncie to use HUD program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and City of Muncie's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if objections are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Muncie; (b) the City of Muncie has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be e-mailed to the HUD Indianapolis Field Office at CPD_COVID-19OEE-IND@hud.gov. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
